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FORSCOM Regulation 190-40, 1 June 1995 is superceded; Army Regulation 190-40, dated 30 November 1993, is supplemented as follows:

Paragraph 3-2. Add the following subparagraph:

c. Category 3 Serious Incident. (See Para D-1)

(1) Category 3 Serious Incidents will be telephonically reported to the FORSCOM Operations Center immediately upon discovery or notification at the installation level. Submission of an electronic message to CDRFORSCOM Fort McPherson GA//AFSG//AFPM//) will follow telephonic notification within 48 hours.

(2) Following telephonic notification, **Army Aviation Accident** serious incident reports will be prepared and submitted to CDRFORSCOM Fort McPherson GA//AFSG//AFPM//AFOP-AV//AFPI-SO.

(3) Category 3 Serious Incident Reports are **not** addressed outside FORSCOM HQS.

Figure 3-1. Add the following to the unnumbered paragraph titled "Subject: The SIR Number":

Category 3 incidents will have an eight space alphanumeric identifier. The first two digits will contain the last two digits of the calendar year. The next two spaces will contain the letters "AF" to identify the report as FORSCOM specific. The last four digits, beginning with 0001, are the sequential number for the Category 3 reports submitted to HQs FORSCOM in that calendar year. Numbering sequences for FORSCOM Category 3 reports will be separate from those used for Categories 1 and 2 reports to HQDA.

Paragraph 3-6. Add the following paragraph:

3-6. Other FORSCOM reporting requirements

- a. Commander's location. When CONUSA, division, separate brigade, or FORSCOM installation commanders are to be absent from their duty location, their status must be reported to the FORSCOM Operations Center 72 hours prior to departure. Report changes to planned itineraries as soon as possible.
- b. FORSCOM units on non-FORSCOM installations will submit reports through the installation headquarters. However, applicable commander's location reports will be submitted directly to FORSCOM.
- c. Timeliness of reporting is essential and necessary. Submit telephonic reports even when information is incomplete. Update these reports as additional information becomes available.

Figure 3-7. Change the office symbol in the FORSCOM message address to read:
CDRFORSCOM Fort McPherson GA//AFSG//.

Paragraph C-1m. Add the sentence: "Reserve Component soldiers enroute to or returning from duty/training will be reported within this category."

Appendix D (added)

Category 3. Reportable Serious Incidents

D-1. Actual or alleged incidents involving the following:

- a. Serious injury of a FORSCOM soldier (active duty or reserve component soldier on active duty training status), regardless of cause.
- b. Any loss of weapons.
- c. All Class A, B, or C Army Aviation (flight, flight related or aircraft ground) accidents.
 - (1) Class A accident - Army accident, property damage is \$1M or more; fatality or permanent total disable.
 - (2) Class B accident - Army accident, property damage is \$200K or more but less than \$1M; and/or injury resulting in permanent partial disability, or when five or more personnel are hospitalized from single occurrence.
 - (3) Class C accident - Army accident property damage is \$10K or more but less than \$200K; a nonfatal injury that causes any loss of time from work.
- d. On or off-post terrorist threats/activities directed against FORSCOM soldiers or assets.
- e. Fires or other natural disasters causing the destruction of 500 or more acres of vegetation. This requirement includes all property located on the installation, or Army owned/leased property including USAR Centers, not located on but supported by the installation.
- f. Any incident that may result in adverse publicity for the Army or Forces Command.
